INTRODUCTION

“And let them scratch wherever is the itch...” - *Paradiso XVII*, 129¹

The present war in Ukraine has become a source of great division not only among Catholics, but also among the right-wing circles in the West. It is, after all, all too tempting for us to side with Russia when the usual troop of leftist dominated institutions that have cried out unanimously in favor of the pseudo-moralistic causes of BLM and the sodomites now call for universal, unquestioning support of Ukraine. However, to see this conflict in terms of Russia, which (supposedly) represents tradition and order, liberating a Ukraine which, under the reign of President Zelensky, has increasingly become a proxy of the decadent West, is to become blinded to the reality of the situation. We should neither be for the governments of Russia or Ukraine, as these are controlled and influenced by our enemies to create a crisis, by means of this present war, to fulfill the globalist aims of a One World Government.

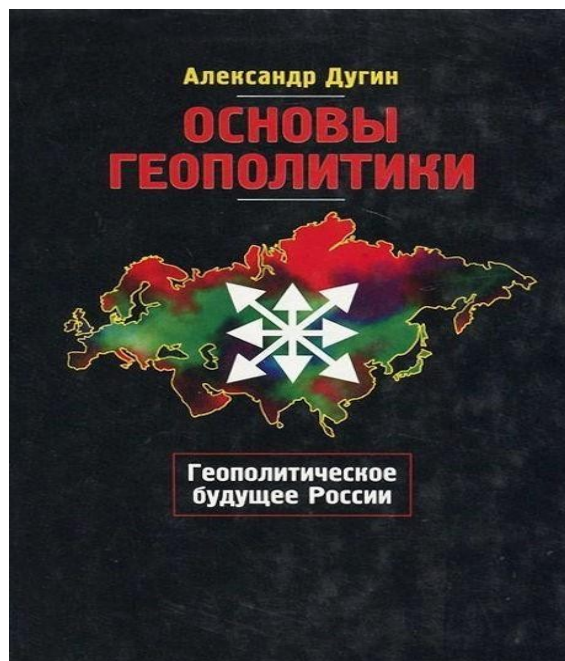
I will set out, in the following pages, to define the Eurasianist ideology espoused by Russian political theorist Aleksandr Dugin, and his significant ties and influence within Russia and the West. We will look at his own statements so that readers may form an accurate assessment of his beliefs. Then, we will delve into the subject of ideological subversion by the Kremlin in Western dissident circles. We shall then examine how some of Putin’s political actions and statements (including those involving this present war) align with Dugin’s stated aims in his most important work, *Foundations of Geopolitics*, and what Catholics ought to do in light of this information.

Take heed, good reader, of the information presented here in this little work; do not allow yourself to become wrapped up in emotion to dismiss what lies within, but read it with patience, and you will learn much from it.

THE MAN BEHIND PUTIN'S CURTAIN

Aleksandr Dugin is a man of immense political influence in Russia, to the point that he has even been dubbed “Putin’s Rasputin”, due to his apparent ties to the Russian President. His background, shadowy as it is, provides the foundations for how this came to be. His father, Geli Alexandrovich Dugin, was a lieutenant general in the GRU, which acts as a foreign intelligence bureau within the realm of the Russian military, similar in some respects to the now disbanded NKVD. Starting in 1992 as an adjunct professor, he taught at the Academy of the General Staff of the Russian Armed Forces, considered to be the most prestigious academy for the training of military officers within the country. It was during his tenure at this institution that he published his most influential work within Russia, one that has with an ominously high level of accuracy predicted the course of Russia’s involvement on the world stage in the decades since its publication: *Foundations of Geopolitics: The Geopolitical Future of Russia* (1997).



During the writing of this book, Dugin was advised by General Nikolai Klokov of the General Staff Academy as an official consultant, and was also reportedly advised by Lenoid Ivashov, head of the Internal Department of the Russian Ministry of Defense. This work is presently used as a textbook in Russian military schools, and its influence among the Russian elite is indisputable. ²

An online researcher, who goes by the username of Thuletide, provided further details concerning these connections:

“After writing FoG, Dugin was hired as a guest lecturer by the military, to explain his geopolitical Neo-Eurasianist theory to Russian officers and the likes. Seleznyov, a former Russian State Duma speaker and a buddy of Dugin, urged that FoG should be incorporated into the Russian school curriculum.”

Before delving into the complexities surrounding this work, it is paramount to understand that what lies at the heart of Dugin’s ideology has for the center of its drama the battle between East and West, between “Eurasia” and “Atlantis”. As he wrote in *Foundations of Geopolitics*, “The new Eurasian empire will be **constructed on the fundamental principle of the common enemy**: the rejection of Atlanticism, strategic control of the USA.”

Eurasia represents not only certain territorial ambitions to expand Russia’s borders into the territories it once possessed under the Soviet Union and the Tsarist Empire, but to take Europe all for itself. But as Dugin wrote in “Eurasia: A Special Worldview”, “Eurasia is not only a geographical concept; it is also a whole theory, system, and special worldview.” And in what theory does Eurasia lie?

For centuries the West has striven to impose its norms and criteria upon all of mankind. This is its civilizational policy. **And this has not changed over the centuries regardless of what stands at the forefront of the West’s ideology, be it Catholicism, Protestantism, Modernism, Liberalism, or Capitalism.** With equal fervor the West builds its Empire at the expense of all other peoples. On the world map this is reflected in expansion from Europe to Asia and, most importantly, Eurasia, i.e., the territory of the Russian Empire situated in the key zone of the absolute center. **To the west of us is Europe. To the east – Asia. We ourselves are something third.**

The West believes that only its path of development, only its logic, and only its values are universal and common to all of mankind, and that all other peoples have simply not yet understood this. This means that the West, albeit temporarily (until they understand this), can and is even obliged to rule others. **With such a blatant agenda, the West has in practice managed to colonize the East.** This is no easy feat, but it managed to. **But the West faltered in the face of Russia, Eurasia. We, Russians, opposed the West with something that stopped it in its tracks. It repeatedly tried**

to take us by force and ruse, but we held on. The East fell, but we didn't. And we are holding out to this day. This is Eurasia as an idea.

Eurasia means not succumbing to the West's claims to universality, rejecting its hegemony, and insisting that no one has a monopoly on truth, especially not the West. Eurasia is the possibility for peoples and civilizations to follow their own path and, if the logic of the path demands such, not only a non-Western one, but even an anti-Western path. This is Eurasia. This idea was understood by the first Eurasianists, Trubetzkoy, Savitsky, and Alekseev in the 1920's. We too understand it. And Vladimir Putin understands it, since there is no other meaning of Eurasia.³

The problem inherent in this East against West conflict that he draws upon finds its origin in the Great Schism, a fact confirmed by Dugin himself and Nikolai Sergeevich Trubetzkoy, the founding father of early twentieth century Eurasianism. According to both thinkers, Russia is not, and cannot ever be, a Westernized European state, but rather must function as its own separate civilization. Dugin confirms that both “share common roots with Greco-Roman civilization”, but states that it was the gradual collapse of the Western Roman Empire, along with its separation from Byzantium, that created a rift in this union between East and West that reached its conclusion in 1054, the year in which, “the Orthodox and Catholic worlds parted ways once and for all”.⁴ Thus the idea of Russia's necessary “exclusion” from Europe, from the Eurasianist point of view, finds its root in the Great Schism, therefore proving that the conflict between East and West, like all human conflict, (as Cardinal Manning put it) is ultimately theological. A crucial point that must be mentioned is that Dugin sees Russia as the leader of the Orthodox world, as he considers Russia to be the inheritor of the “Byzantine mission” after the fall of Constantinople. However, such claims do not mean he is an Eastern Orthodox zealot; in fact, he is truly a gnostic, as I shall later prove.

With the understanding that what Dugin means by “the West” is not just the Europe of today, a cripple of its former self, but even that Europe which was once united by the Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church, we can truly realize the horror of his statements. To him, Catholicism is just another “ideology” in a long line of ideologies used by the West to spread its self-asserted universal ideas, which is absurd. Catholic values are quite substantially different from the “universal” values of those other creeds he lists. One only needs to compare the depth of Dante's *Divina Commedia* to the sleazy and superficial literature that dominates Western bookstores

today to see the difference. Or perhaps if that is not fitting enough, compare modernist architecture, bland, lifeless, and cheap, to the beautiful, ennobling, and ornate architecture of the Middle Ages to again witness this divergence in thought. Furthermore, Dugin's implication that it was the West that used Catholicism to spread its own values is to, as the saying goes, put the cart before the horse. It was rather that the Universal Church took upon itself the Great Commission which had been given to it by its Divine Founder, Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ:

“Going therefore, teach ye all nations; baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.” - *Matthew 28:18*

Therefore, it was (as history shows us) the Catholic Church that worked in tandem with firstly the converted Roman Empire, and then the nations of the West forged by the Church from the remnants of that Empire, to spread the Faith throughout the world. However, Dugin is justified in pointing out the evils of the decadent West in spreading the false ideologies of Protestantism, Modernism, Liberalism, and Capitalism as “universal truths”, which they are not. But, it is only Catholicism that has the exclusive right to universal truth, and therefore the West had, and has, the right to spread it throughout the world.

Dugin is not only a schismatic on religious and civilizational grounds, but also on the grounds of race. Ethnic identity is a biological reality, and to deny it is foolish. To deny this reality, which is not only linked to the melanin content in one's skin, is similar to denying the differences between the species of birds God has so wonderfully made – it is an insult to human reason, and even to God's Creation.⁵ It is precisely on the point of racial, or ethnic hatred that the Western Leftists offend gravely against what has been termed the White, or European race. To despise any race (to will their evil), to deny that they possess souls made in God's own image and the dignity that comes with it, is to offend gravely against charity. But to despise in particular the European race is a symptom for one's hatred of Christendom, as the history of Europe and the Catholic Faith are immensely interwoven. To Europe was granted that vineyard (the Church) which was anticipated by the Jews of the Old Covenant, but which they lost through their rejection of Christ. As Jesus tells us:

Hear ye another parable. There was a man, an householder, who planted a vineyard, and made a hedge round about it, and dug in it a press, and built a tower, and let it out to husbandmen; and went into a strange country. And when the time of the fruits drew nigh, he sent his servants to the husbandmen that they might receive the fruits thereof. And the husbandmen laying hands on his servants, beat one, and killed another, and stoned another. Again he sent other servants more

than the former; and they did to them in like manner. And last of all he sent to them his son, saying: They will reverence my son. But the husbandmen seeing the son, said among themselves: This is the heir: come, let us kill him, and we shall have his inheritance. And taking him, they cast him forth out of the vineyard, and killed him. When therefore the lord of the vineyard shall come, what will he do to those husbandmen?

- *Matthew 22:33-39*

The householder (God the Father) sent His Son (the heir) to the husbandmen of the vineyard (the Jews) after these husbandmen killed the servants of the householder (the prophets).

“And last of all he sent to them his son, saying: They will reverence my son.”

- *Matthew 21:37*

However, what happened was that what could have been the occasion for the complete conversion of the Jewish people from the perverse innovations of the Pharisees was turned into a stumbling block, a source of blindness for them on account of their rejection of Christ. For this reason Jesus said to the Jews: “For judgment I am come into this world; that they who see not, may see; and they who see, may become blind” (John 9:39).⁶

The Jews knew that He was the Son; in the parable, this is represented by the husbandmen seeing the son and saying to themselves: “This is the heir.” Instead of using this knowledge to restore their relationship with the householder through honoring his only son, they said “come, let us kill him, and we shall have his inheritance.” Therefore, Christ spoke of the future conversion of the European peoples, and their dominant role in the Church when He said:

“What therefore will the lord of the vineyard do? He will come and destroy those husbandmen; and will give the vineyard to others.” - *Matthew 21:40*

Though some Jews accepted their Messiah when He came, such as the Apostles, and many of the first converts, most rejected Him then, and sadly since then the Jews have continued *en masse* in the following their ancestors' blindness. It was the Gentiles, the men “not of this fold” who were more willing to accept Christ (as is proved by history, and the witness of Cornelius and St. Longinus in the Gospel) than those who called Moses their father, yet did not heed this warning that prophet had received from God:

“I will raise them up a prophet out of the midst of their brethren like to thee: and I will put my words in his mouth, and he shall speak to them all that I shall command him. And he that will not hear his words, which he shall speak in my name, I will be the revenger.” - *Deuteronomy 18:18*

Thus, the foundation for the hatred that the Jews have towards Europeans is founded in the fact that they rejected Christ, and that the Church, which is the spiritual Israel, was given to these men. To hate Europeans is to hate their civilization; to hate their civilization is to hate Christendom, which is ultimately to hate Christ. One of the early Eurasianists, Richard von Coudenhove-Kalergi, a Freemason who possessed strong philosemitic tendencies, followed this logic exactly.

His infamous plan, described in brief in his 1925 book *Praktischer-Idealismus*, detailed his desire to force multiculturalism in Europe and to bring about thereby a dilution of the European peoples, so that, in his view, only the racially pure Jews would be left to become the “spiritual nobility of Europe.”⁷

Here are his exact words from the aforementioned work:

“The man of the future will be of mixed race. Today's races and classes will gradually disappear owing to the vanishing of space, time, and prejudice. The Eurasian-Negroid race of the future, similar in its appearance to the Ancient Egyptians, will replace the diversity of peoples with a diversity of individuals. [...]

Instead of destroying European Jewry, Europe, against its own will, refined and educated this people into a future leader-nation through this artificial selection process. No wonder that this people, that escaped Ghetto-Prison, developed into a spiritual nobility of Europe. Therefore a gracious Providence provided Europe with a new race of nobility by the Grace of Spirit. This happened at the moment when Europe's feudal aristocracy became dilapidated, and thanks to Jewish emancipation.”⁸

Warburg remained sincerely interested in the movement for the remainder of his life and served as an intermediate for Coudenhove-Kalergi with influential Americans such as banker Paul Warburg and financier Bernard Baruch.”

Dugin is no different in regards to his anti-White rhetoric. Let us hear him in his own words:

“Fourth political theory expands the critique of racism to not only biological racism and nationalism, but into all forms of the acceptance of inequality in human societies, whether based on cultural, religious, technological, or economic grounds. The Fourth Political Theory rejects all forms of racism and refuses to consider “race” [...] as the subject of history.”⁹

“The dividing line between the European 4PT and the third way [Fascism, Nationalism, etc.]: the refusal of any kind of nationalism, chauvinism, Eurocentrism, universalism, racism, or xenophobic attitude.”¹⁰

“Thus, modern Gramscianism calls for a counter-hegemonic bloc, a Global Revolutionary Alliance, that brings together all [...] those who oppose the hegemony of Euro-centrism and racism.”¹¹

“Every westerner is a racist...Western civilization is a racist, ethnocentric civilization...the civilizations of the West and the East are very different. The eastern one is superior in that it fights against the racism of the western one. [...] The ethnocentrism of Western Europe is a constant. You don't have to be surprised about the concentration camps. [...] All European philosophers are racists.”¹²

“We Russians are not nationalists, we have never been a nation. When we speak of “ours”, it is not meant ethnically. The Chechen also belongs to us or the Uzbek. We have said to the Turkish or Mongolian peoples: You are now part of the Orthodox culture, but we will not persecute you. You will have your mosques, you will be able to pray. When we speak of an orthodox folk spirit, It does not mean that we declare war on other cultures.”¹³

“It is necessary to discard this racist model of the division of different societies (both biological racism and cultural), to affirm that civilizations are different, and that the criterion of Western civilization is not universal. [...] we first need to develop a theory of a multipolar world, a theory of the

equality of civilizations, and in the most brutal way to overthrow the West-centric racism.”¹⁴

Much like Kalergi, he also explicitly calls for the genocide of Europeans, and with them, the expunging of their civilization:

“I am a supporter of blacks. White civilization; their cultural values, false, dehumanizing model of the world, built by them – did not pay off. Everything goes to the beginning of the anti-white pogroms on a planetary scale. Russia saved only by the fact that we are not pure white. Predatory multinational corporations, oppression and suppression of all others, MTV, gays and lesbians – this is the fruit of white civilization, from which it is necessary to get rid of. So I am for reds, yellows, greens, blacks – but not for whites.”¹⁵

“West is geographical Satan, geographical Antichrist. The West should pay for everything. It would be best to settle it with Chinese, Tatars, Muslims, all this Eurasian nomadism. [...] The West is dead land. He will revive only when he is settled by Cossacks, Tajiks, and Kazakhs. They will bring life with them.”¹⁶

An intriguing connection between Kalergi and the former quote from Dugin can be found again in *Praktischer-Idealismus*:

“The precursor of the planetary man of the future is the Russian Slavic-Tatar-Finnish mongrel of modern Europe; because he, among all the peoples of Europe, is the race of the typical multi-soul people with a wide ranging, encompassing soul.”¹⁷

This catalogue of quotes demonstrates his absurd and contradictory tone on race. According to him, the “only thing” that saves Russia is that it is not “pure white”, yet how can racial purity exist in the first place, if also according to him, race is merely a social invention, a “subject of history”? Evidently, he is just as inconsistent on this point as the Western liberals he so often decries.

Dugin is also a Communist, though not a materialist one, as he has professed that the Jewish “Kabbalah” represents the “greatest achievement of the human spirit” and holds all sorts of beliefs in the occult, and is a Satanist.¹⁸ His symbol, the “Eurasianist Star” is based on a symbol

representing “Chaos Magic” which was present on Aleister Crowley’s tarot card deck. I invite you, dear reader, to view the image on page 15, which speaks a thousand words on this point.

His strange cocktail of “red occultism”, if it may be termed as such, finds its most sincere yet horrifying expression in the following words, with emphasis added from myself:

The dogma should be accepted that people do not live, but rather an Angel lives through us. The brighter and more intensely it lives through us, the higher the hierarchical level of he through whom the Angel lives and, as follows, the lesser the individual element of he through which it lives. **The Angel and ego are present in a person in inverse proportion: the greater the Angel, the lesser the ego.** The more modest and ascetic a person is and the less individual he is, the higher the rank he occupies in the true hierarchy. In the highest of people, there should be nothing individual, egoistic, and material....**People, intimately knowing Stalin, will testify to his extreme simplicity in being. For example, they will tell of how he, at the zenith of his power, preferred to sleep on a cot. Another communist ruler of imperial scale, Mao Zedong, tried to never touch money, which he hated physically. The very thought of money or touching it caused him physical pain. These are signs that an angelic presence is close.** These are also the marks of a good leader.¹⁹

Firstly, while it is true that each of us is given a guardian angel by Almighty God,²⁰ to say that “an Angel lives through us”, and that furthermore the “angelic” side of man’s soul is in competition with his “ego”, is not a Christian understanding of the soul; it is plainly heretical. His belief seems to be a perversion of the true and wonderful doctrine that those who live in the state of grace possess the indwelling of the Trinity.²¹ It is true that the fallen flesh often is in opposition to the desires of the soul,²² but it is possible for the soul to become so blinded by sin it sees no fault in succumbing to the weakness of the flesh. It seems that Dugin is influenced by some variant of Catharism in his belief that the material, especially money, is *inherently* evil. It is the *desire* for money that is “the root of all evil” according to St. Paul,²³ that is, the desire for excess and luxury.

His praise of Stalin and Mao falls through entirely when one looks at the truth that both tyrants developed major cults of personality surrounding themselves that were rigorously enforced upon by their governments, clearly not something a humble or modest leader would establish. And let not the innocent millions both those men are responsible for putting to death be forgotten. But the logic is consistent; idolatry is always followed by bloodshed.

He also voiced his loyalty to the false ideals of the Soviet Union and its false messiah, Joseph Stalin, in a 2012 interview wherein he stated:

“I’ve been struggling with this for 25 years [...] wanting to unite Soviet and Russian patriots [...] We are on the side of Stalin and the Soviet Union.”²⁴

In addition to this, Dugin also published an article in 2000, shortly after the election of Vladimir Putin, in which he wrote that the KGB ought to be “the backbone of the Eurasian Renaissance.”²⁵ In an FAQ for the National Bolshevik party, a political movement he co-founded and played an active role in during the 1980s and 1990s, we find the following words:

Any form of xenophobia, anti-Semitism, racial intolerance is alien to the National Bolsheviks. [...] the NBP has nothing to do with neo-Nazis and all kinds of narrow-minded Hitlerists. [...] National Bolsheviks are nationalists of the soil, not nationalists of the blood. This means that for us the ethnic origin of a person does not matter Soil nationalism, imperial nationalism – this is a true manifestation of the Russian idea, in contrast to racist ideas fashionable in certain circles, borrowed from the West and foreign to our national mentality. Unlike ethno-nationalists (neo-Nazis), we do not want to separate the Russians from other peoples who have lived with us for centuries. [...] we consider the Soviet period of our history as a historical stage in which Russia reached the highest point of its power. The October Revolution, the Great Triumph of 1945 – these are the unconditional victories of Russian civilization. Our Bolshevism, the hammer and sickle on the flag means that the National Bolsheviks see themselves as the continuers of these achievements.²⁶

Thus, it is clear that Dugin has always envisioned his ideology – whether it be National Bolshevism or Eurasianism – as a spiritual successor to the original “errors of Russia” which Our Lady of Fatima warned us about all the way back in 1917.²⁷

Now that the theory and worldview of Eurasianism has been explained at length, we can now evaluate *Foundations of Geopolitics* and understand the methodology contained therein. This book provides the most straightforward summary of the strategic aspects of this ideology, at least from the parts that have been translated, as no official English translation of this work currently exists. Within its pages, Dugin provides geopolitical goals and advice to his allies within the Russian government to bring about the toppling of the Washington-led Atlanticist "unipolar" world order and to ensure the ascendancy of the Moscow-led Eurasianist "multipolar" world order. One of the most revealing finds is this paraphrased excerpt, taken from the book's *Wikipedia* page, concerning how Russia should utilize its intelligence agencies within the United States:

"Tasks in the United States:"

- Russia should use its special forces within the borders of the United States to fuel instability and separatism. For instance, provoke "Afro-American racists." Russia should "introduce geopolitical disorder into internal American activity, encouraging all kinds of separatism and ethnic, social and racial conflicts, actively supporting all dissident movements – extremist, racist, and sectarian groups, thus destabilizing internal political processes in the U.S. It would also make sense simultaneously to support isolationist tendencies in American politics.³⁰

Though many are familiar with the Russian meddling hoax, which formulates that Russian hackers and intelligence personnel rigged the 2016 Presidential Election in favor of Donald Trump, there are some key details surrounding those claims that have been conspicuously untouched by the mass media. The most important of these is that Russian intelligence operatives ("special forces") were documented in that election cycle to have "created hundreds of fake personas linked to social media accounts" and had these accounts consistently post content

that either strongly denounced or defended the “Afro-American racists” of the now infamous Black Lives Matter organization.³¹

This double-sided propaganda campaign, undoubtedly influenced by Dugin’s preferred strategy of causing chaos through subversion crossed into the real world, as:

“In one instance, social media accounts used by Russia's Internet Research Agency simultaneously promoted opposing protests in New York City; one in support of the Black Lives Matter movement, and the other against it. In one case, Russian operatives even hired individuals to organise protests.”³²

In the 2020 election cycle, similar attempts were undertaken by Russian intelligence to create agitprop favoring Black Lives Matter. In particular, Kremlin-backed “Internet Research Agency”, which had been behind the aforementioned fake social media accounts back in 2016, was discovered to have created a phony pro-BLM leftist news organization that included its own set of fake editors. I present here the most relevant excerpts from the September 2020 *Fox News* article covering this incident:

Russia is now making moves online directed at influencing Black Lives Matter and Black voters ahead of 2020, multiple intelligence sources tell Fox News.

On Tuesday, Facebook revealed Russia's infamous Internet Research Agency (IRA) created a fake left-wing news outlet complete with fictional editors. The IRA was indicted in connection with 2016 election interference with two other Russian entities and 13 Russians in February 2018 as part of Special Counsel Robert Mueller's investigation.

"The IRA-linked campaign we removed in August was largely unsuccessful on Facebook, but it tricked unwitting freelance journalists into writing stories on its behalf," Facebook said in a statement. "We're notifying people who we believe have been contacted by this network." Facebook has now removed the accounts, and the FBI is investigating.

"We consider strategic engagement with U.S. technology companies, which includes sharing threat indicators, to be critically important in combating malign foreign influence actors," the FBI told Fox News in a statement.

"While technology companies independently make decisions regarding the content of their platforms and the safety of their members, the FBI is actively engaged with our

federal partners, election officials and the private sector to mitigate foreign threats to our nation's security and our elections," the FBI continued.³³

These attempts at radicalizing Black Americans into supporting BLM have a considerable precedent, as during the Soviet era the Kremlin utilized similar tactics of pitting Blacks against Whites. The range of tactics differed from Soviet officials publicly confronting American diplomats with whataboutist statements like "And you are lynching Negroes" all the way to backing a plot to create a breakaway communist "Negro Republic" within the United States.³⁴ From this, an apparent pattern emerges of using Blacks as "useful idiots" to simultaneously make the Kremlin's image on the world stage look much more benign than it actually was, all while throwing a wrench into American domestic affairs.

As was indicated beforehand, Russian propaganda is not limited only to influencing only those on the Left, but also on the Right. It seems that much of the Dissident Right's beliefs about Russian society and politics emanates from *Russian Insider*, a website that was founded in 2014 by American businessman Charles Bausman that had the initial aim of defending the Russian seizure of Crimea to a Western readership. It is no small statement indeed for me to write that much of these erroneous beliefs come from *Russia Insider*, as most of their articles consist of pushing the narrative that Russia is a bastion of Christian values, functioning like a "best-of" compilation of Russian culture and history (while occasionally slipping in headlines like "The 7 Best Soviet Songs to Play on Victory Day"), leaving out the much more nuanced reality.³⁵ There are a decent amount of blatant propaganda articles, with the author's personal favorite example being "The 'Baltic States' Are Fake Countries - They Were Founded, Built and Populated by Germans", with this one no doubt intended to preemptively justify some "special military operations" after this present war with Ukraine is over.³⁶

Intriguingly, a rather concise refutation of Bausman's presentation of Russia can be found in an op-ed article from *RT*, perhaps the most well-known of Russia's state news organizations. I quote here the most relevant excerpts:

As a result, we have a situation where a bunch of westerners are harming Russia by using the country's name to promote an agenda which isn't part of Russian discourse. And this is a phenomenon displayed in the behaviour of many zealots, who 'support' Russia as keyboard-warrior crusaders but don't understand the place at all, in reality.

Instead, they are projecting their own issues with their homelands onto this country and its leaders. For instance, American and European far-rightists think that because Vladimir Putin has restored Russia as a strong and sovereign state, he's somehow aligned with their beliefs. And is on some kind of mission from God to save 'white' Christianity.

But, he's not. Because Russia may well be the most ethnically and religiously diverse country in Europe. And Putin's own cabinets have included a smorgasbord of Jews, Muslims and Buddhists in addition to the Christians and Agnostics who form the largest Russian 'belief' categories.

Sure, Putin has restored the prominence of the Orthodox faith and identifies as a believer himself. But that's a cultural thing, rooted in hundreds of years of Russian history. And he's not attempting to restore the official state religion of the Tsarist period. Nor has he publicly considered banning abortion or outlawing homosexual relations, measures the church has frequently called for.

Instead, the Russian President has personally attended the opening of Russia's largest mosque, in Moscow, and has been described in a Reuters article as "*the closest thing Israel has ever had to a friend in Moscow.*" While Russia's chief rabbi, Berel Lazar, says "*Putin is on our side.*" He even told the Limmud FSU how "*Putin was the first president to publicly speak out against anti-Semitism and did the most for the Jews. There is no institutional anti-Semitism in Russia. The attitude toward the Jews in Russia is excellent.*"³⁷

Since Bausman's website is so critical in spreading the absurdly false narrative of Eurasian saviorism, it begs the question: *why* does he push this propaganda?

Thuletide once again provides some key information, here concerning Bausman's ties to Russia and to the American Alt-Right:

Bausman is reportedly financed by Russian oligarch Konstantin Malofeev, who is sometimes called "Putin's Soros" ([source](#)). Malofeev also funds Russian separatists in Ukraine and founded/funded Aleksandr Dugin's thinktank 'Katehon,' which is dedicated to subverting gullible idiots in the West, and the television channel 'Tsargrad,' which hosts Dugin's TV show ([source](#)). Alexander Borodai, the former prime minister of the Russian separatist Donetsk People's Republic, worked as Malofeev's public relations consultant ([source](#)).

The National Justice Party, co-founded by leaders of TheRightStuff.biz and the openly Eurasianist Traditionalist Workers Party, hosts events at a barn owned by Charles Bausman. The five-acre property was purchased by Bausman for \$450,000 in 2020 and is also the home of NJP co-founder, Greg Conte ([source](#)). Apparently, Eric Striker's National-Justice website shares a Google Analytics account with Bausman's Russia Insider and uses the same web code ([source](#)). Is Bausman acting as middleman between Kremlin-affiliated financiers and the Alt-Right? It would certainly explain their deranged Duginist ideology.³⁸

Now the pieces come together. Although *Russia Insider* is actually an American-based website, considering that Bausman likely received funds and support from Malofeev for this project, it is essentially a front to dupe "useful idiots" on the Right to support Russia on the basis that it, under Putin's guiding hand, is earnestly trying to "save" Western civilization from its liberal overlords. For those unaware of what Thuletide writes of when he mentions the "deranged Duginist ideology" of the American Alt-Right, I have inserted the following images which illustrate this disturbing series of relationships, starting on page 21.

Dugin has also been pictured alongside many influential figures in Western dissident circles. One of these is E. Michael Jones, who has gained quite a reputation for his repeated attacks towards “Fatima fundamentalists”, (i.e. those who acknowledge the reality that Russia has not been consecrated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary). Perhaps Jones’ myopic view of Russia as a pro-Christian nation that defends its culture from the “gay disco” of the Global American Empire (or the Atlanticist Empire, according to Dugin) is the result of ideological osmosis? This is far more likely than the assertion that Jones (and others who take a similar stance on Russia) are paid agents, as Thuletide explains in one of his articles:

It should not be assumed that any pro-Russian pundit is on the Kremlin payroll. That would not be necessary for this sort of ideological subversion, which may only require a few key mouthpieces to inject these subversive ideas into a dissident sphere (see: Arktos Media publishing Dugin’s books for a Western audience). These subversive ideas spread via cultural osmosis (which is the most common way that people absorb ideology), especially if they are regurgitated by an influential figurehead. Does this mean that *nobody* is being paid to shill Russian ideological propaganda? Absolutely not. Western spooks run operations in the East, particularly targeting dissident movements, and Eastern spooks respond in kind.³⁹

Truly can it be said that an image is worth a thousand words. While Dugin's approach to the nations of continental Europe in *Foundations of Geopolitics* is different from his advice concerning the United States, what underlines both strategies are the usage of divide and conquer tactics. With the United States, he is clear in utilizing Russian intelligence agents as assets to stir up enough domestic unrest to force Washington into taking its attention off the world stage to make a geopolitical vacuum for Eurasia to fill in. But with Europe, he encourages a multi-pronged diplomacy effort aimed at undermining the European Union and replacing it with smaller pro-Russian blocs that would prepare the nations within for what Dugin terms "Finlandization".

This concept, as Thuletide describes, is:

...when a powerful entity (usually a country but not necessarily) forces a less powerful country to abide by its laws while allowing the less powerful country to maintain pseudo-independence and its own political system (within the confines of its master's laws). You could describe the dominance of the New World Order globalists (UN, EU, World Bank, IMF, etc.) over our own countries as a form of Finlandization on a global scale. Finlandization is similar to the creation of vassal states, but unlike a vassal relationship, the small state does not benefit at all.⁴⁰

To prepare for this, in *Foundations of Geopolitics* Dugin encouraged the idea that the United Kingdom should be politically removed from continental Europe, which was achieved with Brexit. For France and Germany, he proposed an alliance between both that would solidify a preexisting Moscow-Berlin axis.⁴¹ Evidently Dugin's ties to the Identitarians, a movement which originated in France but also gained significant traction in the UK, Germany, and Austria, is aimed at using them as "useful idiots" under the guise of helping to liberate them from the tyranny of Brussels, only to subject them to the tyranny of Moscow. He acts as a kind of false apostle, spreading his doctrines from place to place, as an agent of the unconverted Russia, the nation which according to prophecy shall be an instrument of chastisement to an unbelieving world.

Dugin has influenced other European nationalist movements, such as the Golden Dawn, a Greek nationalist movement. An article which advocated a pro-Russian stance among their followers was written and published on their website in 2014, entitled "Golden Dawn in Moscow: We set the foundations of Greek-Russian cooperation", conspicuously after they admitted to meeting with several Russian officials, including Dugin, whom they described as Putin's "top advisor". The same article claimed that Greek nationalists should rally around Moscow because "Golden Dawn is a natural ally of Russia, and is fighting American expansionist policies," and also stating that "Greece needs to lead a cultural (and geographical) empire in the Mediterranean region."⁴² Additionally, Golden Dawn's Australian website declared back in 2016 that "Golden Dawn holds true to its word that should (or when) we take power, to align the Greek state against the Zionists of Washington, and towards our comrades in Moscow."⁴³

These words coincide with Dugin's statement in *Foundation of Geopolitics* that Greece, as a member of the "orthodox collectivist East", would join with Russia to "reject the rational-individualistic West."⁴⁴

Despite these sincere words, it appears that their allies in the Russian government did practically nothing to defend Golden Dawn when it was ruled a "criminal group" by a Greek court in 2020, effectively banning this political party from the Greek political process and therefore barring it from ever achieving power.⁴⁵ Despite the fact that a Greek nationalist alliance with the Russian state is sensible on the surface level, considering the shared cultural and religious heritage of the two nations, and the common cause these two peoples have often had (after all, Russia was a critical ally in the Greek War of Independence), it was and is a foolish endeavor. This example should serve as a useful lesson to other Western dissidents, as they must understand that if they align themselves with Dugin and Russia, despite all their sacrifices to help further the "One Struggle" against the "hegemonic" power of Washington, Moscow will not come to their aid when it is needed most.

All this boils down to what ex-KGB defector Yuri Bezmenov termed "ideological subversion", which he described as "psychological warfare" through the use of propaganda to change one's perception of reality so that they would not defend the interests of themselves, their families, their communities, and their nations.⁴⁶ Is this not evidently what has happened with the Duginists? It is ironic that self-proclaimed "White Nationalists" would support the ideology of a man who despises their race and their civilization, an ideology which is only really a different flavor of globalism – not a genuine "resistance movement" to the New World Order. Evidently the example of the Identitarians, who wish to honor their European forefathers yet wish to adhere to "respectable" secular values by not insisting upon Catholic orthodoxy in their movement, are yet another proof that the world is a cruel friend to those who love it. To quote the Psalmist, "Unless the Lord build the house, they labour in vain that build it"(Ps. 126:1). The Identitarians, if they continue in their alliance with Dugin, will find themselves left out in the cold if they are crushed by their Western liberal governments, much like how the Golden Dawn were, or perhaps will find themselves betrayed by their new overlords if they help the Eurasianist agenda succeed. And the cause of this is that they have not properly discerned this relationship – the Catholics among them are perhaps the most guilty in this regard, for if they truly took the time to understand

Dugin, they would come to the conclusion that he is a crypto-Communist, something that a faithful Catholic can never endorse.

It is even worse that Catholics would support the Russian state, since as I have proved, it is not acting as a genuine ally to us and to our ideological adjacents, but rather seeks to use us as “useful idiots”. We Catholics, who believe the revelations of Our Lady of Fatima – though not a dogma, but the most credible private revelation in history – that Russia has spread her errors throughout the world...is it really that difficult for us to realize that Russia, as still not having been consecrated, will continue to be a source of chastisement?

PUTIN'S HERMENEUTICS

There may be those who still may assert that Putin himself is a defender of traditional Christian values, even if they will accept the evidence presented in the previous two chapters that one of his top political advisors, Alexander Dugin, promotes an influential form of Neo-Bolshevism (termed “Duginism”) as a proverbial wolf in sheep’s clothing.

Once one gets past the blatant pro-Putin media which emphasizes all the good things he says from time to time concerning traditional Christian values, one gets a sense of the greater picture concerning his actual worldview.

For example, one finds a 2018 article from RT curiously titled “Putin: Communist ideology similar to Christianity, Lenin’s body like saintly relics”. Since it is a rather short piece, it is worth quoting here it in its entirety:

Russian President Vladimir Putin has likened communism to Christianity and Vladimir Lenin’s mausoleum in Moscow’s Red Square to the veneration of the relics of saints.

“Maybe I’ll say something that someone might dislike, but that’s the way I see it,” Putin said in an interview for the documentary Valaam, an excerpt of which was broadcast on Russia 1. *“First of all, faith has always accompanied us, becoming stronger every time our country, our people, have been through hard times.”*

“There were those years of militant atheism when priests were eradicated, churches destroyed, but at the same time a new religion was being created. Communist ideology is very similar to Christianity, in fact: freedom, equality, brotherhood, justice – everything is laid out in the Holy Scripture, it’s all there. And the code of the builder of communism? This is sublimation, it’s just such a primitive excerpt from the Bible, nothing new was invented.”

Putin went further by comparing the Communists’ attitude to the Bolshevik leader Lenin to the veneration of saints in Christianity. *“Look, Lenin was put in a mausoleum. How is this different from the relics of saints for Orthodox Christians and just for Christians? When they say that there’s no such tradition in Christianity, well, how come, go to Athos and take a look, there are relics of the saints there, and we have holy relics here,”* Putin concluded.

After Lenin died in 1924, his body was embalmed and put on display in a

mausoleum in Red Square, Moscow. The cult of Lenin was part of Soviet ideology. The public debate about the possibility of giving Lenin's remains a proper burial began during the early days of Perestroika in the 1980s.

Putin's words were music to the ears of Communist Party members. *"I think these words of the president very effectively and reasonably smooth out the acute angles around the theme of the mausoleum,"* Deputy Chairman of the State Duma Ivan Melnikov said on Sunday, as cited by Interfax.

He said however, that *"communists and all the leftist patriotic forces [in Russia] understand that communism is close to Christianity as much as the form of capitalism that exists in our country and our economy today is far from Christianity."*

Earlier this year, Gennadiy Zyuganov, the head of the Russian Communist Party, said Putin had promised him that as long as he remains president, Lenin's body would remain in the mausoleum in Red Square.

"As long as I sit here, there will be no barbarism in Red Square," the Communist chief quoted Putin as saying at a conference with Russian party leaders.

According to Zyuganov, Putin also dismissed allegations that Lenin was not buried in accordance with Christian traditions. *"As far as the form of the burial is concerned, they used the one that is also used in Orthodox Christianity – he lies a meter and a half below the ground level. Sepulchers and cave burials have been known for a long time,"* Putin said, according to Zyuganov.⁴⁷

These statements are egregious for a variety of reasons. To state, as Putin did in the interview transcribed in this article that “Communist ideology is very similar to Christianity” because both apparently teach the three false virtues of the French Revolution – liberty, equality, fraternity – is objectively a blasphemy. It is true that the Communists, as logical successors to the Jacobins, believed in that wretched slogan. As for the Catholic Church, the true Christian church, she has never proclaimed such absurdity. Moreover, if one looks into the history of the French Revolution and the Napoleonic Wars, one finds that Russia, alongside its schismatical church, was the most vehement opponent of these ideals aside from the Roman Pontiff and those who remained loyal to him in those troubling times. Evidently then, Putin here not only dishonors that which he vaguely terms “Christianity” but also the traditional Russia that opposed the revolutions of 1789 and 1917!

The *Code of the Builders of Communism* he refers to is an actual set of rules which were laid out by the Soviet regime aimed at guiding the moral lives of their citizens.⁴⁸ Its “commandments” were an apparent attempt at aping the Ten Commandments which were given to Moses by Almighty God.

Reproduced below are the contents of these rules:

1. Loyalty to Communism, and love of the socialist Motherland and other socialist countries.
2. Conscious work for the good of the society: One who doesn't work, doesn't get to eat.
3. Care for the collective property, as well as the multiplying of this property.
4. High consciousness of the social responsibilities, and intolerance to the violation of the social interests.
5. Collectivism and comradeship: All for one and one for all.
6. Humane relationships between human beings: One human being is a friend, a comrade and a brother to another human being.
7. Honesty, ethical cleanliness, as well as simplicity and modesty both in private and public life.
8. Mutual respect in the family, and care for the upbringing of the children.
9. Intolerance to the injustice, social parasitism, unfairness, careerism, and acquisitiveness.
10. Friendship and brotherhood with all the nations of the USSR, intolerance to all racial and national dislike.
11. Intolerance to the enemies of communism, peace and freedom of peoples of the world.
12. Brotherly solidarity to all workers of all countries and nations.

As this code itself rather unsurprisingly illustrates, there was no room for God and His Church in Soviet society. Instead of “Thou shalt adore the Lord Thy God” we find their first commandment advocated loyalty to the cause of Communism, love of the Red Empire and other socialist nations. Sure, there are certain moral precepts here that are in accordance for the natural law,

such as “care for the upbringing of children”, but even these would be so tainted by Communist practice that even the slightest praise of their inclusion here ought to be withdrawn. For example, what Communists would term “care for the upbringing of children” would entail government schooling designed ultimately to make the youth servile to the whims of the Party above all else. Such “care” for the youth is not really care at all; it is enslavement, physical and intellectual, to a morally bankrupt system.

With these reflections in mind, how then, we ought to ask, can Putin honestly term the *Code* a “sublimation” and “a primitive excerpt from the Bible”?

Furthermore, the comparison of Lenin’s mausoleum to reliquaries is another example of how Putin is either a fool or a subversive when he speaks of “Christianity”. Lenin was not a Christian, not even a member of the schismatical Russian Orthodox Church. As is known, he was a Jew and an antichrist. Therefore, to grant him a Christian burial (or a burial resembling one) is an insult to the Christian faith, and therefore by continuing to promote the upkeep of this mausoleum, Putin officially endorses this mockery of the True Religion. Given the weight of Lenin’s innumerable crimes against the peoples of Eastern Europe, in particular the Russians, and along with his persecutions of the Catholic Church as well as the Russian Orthodox sect, it is more fitting for the mausoleum to be demolished and his body to be unceremoniously dumped into the nearest river. However, since Putin wishes to push a narrative of continuity between Tsarist Russia, the Soviet Union, and the modern Russian Federation, he is seemingly willing to ignore the most apparent contradictions in doing so. One of the most glaringly obvious, although incredibly controversial, is the Russian Revolution was not truly a “Russian” Revolution in the sense that the majority of its leading figures were not ethnic Russians.⁴⁹ The majority of the Bolshevik cabinets were overwhelmingly made up of Jews, a fact which explains why the Soviet leadership enthusiastically ordered the regicide of the Tsar Nicholas II and his family, along with the genocide of ethnic Russians, such as the kulaks and cossacks. The termination of the Romanov dynasty, a key symbol of Russian identity, was an essential part of the Soviet plan to completely tear down the old Russia.

Putin himself acknowledged the Jewish dominance of the early Bolshevik regime in 2013 when he stated that it was “80-85 percent Jewish” during a speech at Moscow’s Jewish Museum. Of these Jews, he said that they “were guided by false ideological considerations”, ignoring the truth behind the Judeo-Bolshevik connection.⁵⁰ As Alexander Solzhenitsyn pointed out in his controversial work *200 Years Together*:

The question of the mass participation of the Jews in the Bolshevik administration and the atrocities committed by the Jews should be elucidated in a spirit of far-sighted analysis of History. It is not admissible to evade the

question by saying: it was the scum, the renegades of Judaism, we do not have to answer for them.

D. S. Chturmann is right to remind me of my own remarks about the communist leaders of any nation: “they have all turned away from their people and poured into the inhuman.” I believe it. But Pasmanik, was right to write in the 20s: “We cannot confine ourselves to saying that the Jewish people do not answer for the acts committed by one or the other of its members. We answer for Trotsky as long as we have not dissociated ourselves from him.” Now, to dissociate oneself does not mean to turn away, on the contrary, it means rejecting *actions*, to the end, and learning from them.

I have studied Trotsky’s biography extensively, and I agree that he did not have any specifically Jewish attachments, but was rather a fanatical internationalist. Does this mean that a compatriot like him is easier to incriminate than the others? But as soon as his star rose, in the autumn of 1917, Trotsky became, for far too many people, a subject of pride, and for the radical left of the Jews of America, a true idol.⁵¹

Communism for them was a tool to extract revenge for the progroms of Tsarist Russia; but to admit this would be to admit that the Bolshevik revolution was a serious rupture from the Russia that came before it, which Putin is unwilling to do. On one occasion, Putin even described the “collapse” of the USSR as “...the collapse of historical Russia, called the Soviet Union.”⁵² This statement, despite how objectively foolish and disgusting it is, does well to demonstrate Putin’s position on this matter.

This situation is not unlike the Hermeneutic of Continuity proposed by Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI in a seemingly desperate attempt to reconcile the irreconcilable, in that case being the false “Catholicism” of Vatican II and the Traditional Catholic Faith. The continuity Putin proposes here is no continuity at all; he is trying to reconcile the fact that the Bolsheviks were engaged in an attempt to create a civic religion meant to replace Russian Orthodoxy by copying some of its contents and externals. Perhaps it is Putin’s upbringing in the former Soviet Union that has muddied his view of Christianity to this extent; but even if we admit this, we have to point out that he has a duty to learn the truth and right the wrongs in Russia’s past. Or perhaps he is acting in a sinister manner, like his associate Alexander Dugin, to propose this hermeneutic to get mass support within Russia to bring about the Red Empire’s return.

One of the major tenets of modern Russian historiography is the fanatical insistence on the “Great Patriotic War” and how without the “bravery” of Stalin’s legions, the peoples of Russia would have been subject to enslavement and extermination by the Germans and their allies. This narrative is patently false, but it is the only politically acceptable position on the Second World War within Russia. The Putin regime goes so far to defend this narrative that it has enshrined it by making it illegal to publicly compare the actions of the USSR and National Socialist Germany. In the eyes of the Russian state, if you bring up evidence – and mountains of such evidence exist, such as the evidence documented in Joachim Hoffman’s outstanding work, *Stalin’s War of Extermination* – that the Soviet “liberation” of Eastern Europe was nothing more than a monstrous bloodshed, you are spreading “knowingly false information”. Even mentioning the simple fact that the Soviets and the Germans worked together in invading Poland is a criminal offense in Russia, as this real life example demonstrates:

In June 2016, a 37-year-old from Perm, Vladimir Luzgin, was convicted of circulating ‘knowingly false information’ and fined a very steep 200 thousand roubles for reposting an article on his social network page entitled ‘15 facts about Bandera supporters, or what the Kremlin is silent about’. It was specifically the following statement that prompted the criminal charges:

“The communists and Germany jointly invaded Poland, sparking off the Second World War. That is, communism and Nazism closely collaborated...”

This is indisputably correct, however the first instance court found it to be ‘false information’ because it contradicted the facts set out in the Nuremberg Tribunal sentences.⁵³

This stranglehold on historical discussions and disputations has helped to preserve Stalin’s reputation within Russia, even after the supposed “fall” of the Soviet Union. For example, in 2019 the independent pollster Levada Center found that an astounding 70 percent of Russians approved of Joseph Stalin’s role in Russian history.⁵⁴ These examples are but a few of Putin’s defense of the errors of Russia, which despite the “end” of the USSR, still persist in that nation to this very day.

Putin’s ideological similarities to Dugin do not end with his crypto-Communist tendencies. Much like Dugin, Putin is fond of denouncing what he sees as an unjust and even “racist” unipolar world order led by the United States while proposing an allegedly more “fair” multipolar world order led by his own country:

Russian President Vladimir Putin asserted earlier today that the “globalist” world order is “totalitarian” and is “holding back creative pursuit.”

Putin made the comments during a forum in Moscow.

The notorious leader claimed that the west had only achieved its global preeminence due to the historic plunder of other nations and had no moral right to enforce a unipolar model on the planet.

“The model of the total dominance of the so-called ‘golden billion’ is unjust. Why should this ‘golden billion’ among the planet’s population dominate others, impose its own rules of conduct?” Putin asked.

“Based on the illusion of ‘exclusivity,’ this model divides people into first and second class status, and is therefore racist and neo-colonial in its essence,” he added.

“And the globalist, supposedly liberal ideology which underlies it is increasingly acquiring the features of totalitarianism, holding back creative pursuit, free historical creation,” Putin claimed.

The Russian President went on to stress his view that the globalist world order was built off the exploitation of other countries.

“Of course, this ‘golden billion’ did not become ‘golden’ by accident. It has achieved a lot. But it did not only take up its positions thanks to the realization of some ideas, but to a large extent due to the robbery of other peoples – both in Asia and Africa. That’s what happened.”

He then proclaimed that western elites are terrified that their global order is being dismantled.

“No matter how much Western and so-called supranational elites strive to preserve the existing order of things, a new era is coming, a new stage in world history. And only truly sovereign states can ensure high dynamics for growth and become an example for others,” said Putin.⁵⁵

What may catch right-wingers off guard about these statements is the mixture of apparent Marxist rhetoric (Putin’s insistence that globalists, who actually hate Whites, are somehow neo-colonialists and racist towards Asians and Africans) with the blazing condemnation of

globalists (who are leftists) and their insane Neo-Marxist ideology. As those familiar with Dugin may quickly note, this apparent contradiction is no contradiction at all. It is a continuation of the Third Worldist propaganda of the Soviet Union, merely repacked in different terms for a new age. Putin's rhetoric is an appeal to the "Global South" – the African, Asian, and Latin American nations he wishes to recruit into the anti-Atlanticist coalition postulated by Dugin – but is also an appeal to those on the right in the Western nations to see Russia as a kind of liberator from the "totalitarian" Western globalists. Such a picture of the world ignores Russian cooperation with the very globalists Putin condemns when he speaks of the "golden billion" as well as his regime's cooperation with their totalitarian aims.

Putin has a relationship going back decades with the founder of the now infamous World Economic Forum, Klaus Schwab. In fact, Putin was nominated as a member of the WEF's Young Global Leaders organization, which seems to be a kind of globalist recruiting agency for potential civil leaders. Though record of Putin's membership is no longer publicly available, as the WEF website only lists members from 2017 to the present year, Schwab has affirmed Putin's membership on at least two separate occasions:

In a 2017 interview, Klaus Schwab said that Russian President Vladimir Putin had been recognized as a Young Global Leader, and also mentioned Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau: "I have to say, when I mention now names, like Mrs. (Angela) Merkel and even Vladimir Putin, and so on, they all have been Young Global Leaders of the World Economic Forum. But what we are very proud of now is the young generation like Prime Minister (Justin) Trudeau ... We penetrate the cabinet. So yesterday I was at a reception for Prime Minister Trudeau and I know that half of his cabinet, or even more than half of his cabinet, are actually Young Global Leaders." Klaus has mentioned Putin a second time as shown in the documentary *Das Forum*, which goes into behind the scenes footage of the World Economic Forum in Switzerland. In the clip Klaus states "Mrs. Merkel, Tony Blair, even Putin, they were all Young Global Leaders before."⁵⁶

Putin stated at the very beginning of his 2021 address to the World Economic Forum that he first met Schwab back in the early 1990s, specifically 1992 (some years before he became President) and had since that time been a frequent visitor to the WEF. His exact statement is as follows:

Mr. Schwab, dear Klaus, Colleagues,

I have been to Davos many times, attending the events organized by Mr. Schwab, even back in the 1990s. Klaus just recalled that we met in 1992. Indeed, during my time in St Petersburg, I visited this important forum many times. I would like to thank you for this opportunity today to convey my point of view to the expert community that gathers at this world-renowned platform thanks to the efforts of Mr. Schwab.⁵⁷

Considering the major role of Klaus Schwab and his crypto-Communist “Fourth Industrial Revolution” in the globalist grand strategy, this kind of information pokes yet another hole into the narrative of Putin functioning as a Prester John figure. The Russian relationship with Davos is not limited to this personal friendship between Putin and Schwab, as the Russian government officially joined the Center for the Fourth Industrial Revolution back in 2021.⁵⁸

If this is not enough to illustrate that Russia is ultimately a part of the globalist system, then it is well worth considering how one could consider Russia a “rogue state” fighting against the New World Order if its leader has stated that his nation “works hard” at implementing the 2030 Agenda?⁵⁹ In addition, a factor often left out of the discussion of Russia’s role in world events in our time is their cooperation in the globalist-led mass illusion known as the COVID “pandemic”. Similar to the draconian policies imposed by other states, Russia required a “digital pass” back in late 2021 in the name of stopping a scariant “surge”. By November of that year, authorities in all of Russia’s 85 regions imposed, as a part of this effort, a requirement that visitors of “certain public places” must scan a QR code via phone which relates one’s information regarding vaccination status or recent recovery from a COVID case.⁶⁰ The explanation given by authorities as to why this

technocratic system was needed is best summarized by the words of Mikhail Shumakov, who works as the deputy head of Natsionalniye Prioritety, a state-backed NGO which oversees Putin's national priorities:

Fake certificates of a previous illness, PCR test or fake vaccination certificates prolong the pandemic for everyone.⁶¹

Of course, what this evidently represents is a tyrannical measure of further cracking down on those who wish to not "live by lies", as Solzhenitsyn would have put it. It is no accident that all of Russia's regional governments mandated vaccination for "certain categories of workers" shortly before this system was implemented.⁶² On this point, it is worth pointing out that the Sputnik V vaccine was developed with the same human cell line from 1973 that was used in creating the Oxford-AstraZeneca "vaccine".⁶³ Given that this cell line was obtained via abortion, it demonstrates the complicity of the Russian state and its president in the mass crime of injecting people with the remains of a murdered child. Thus we ought to keep in our prayers our Russian Catholic brethren who, like St. Peter and the apostles, proclaim that "We ought to obey God, rather than men",⁶⁴ have seemingly lost their temporal livelihoods so they may avoid transgressing the Fifth Commandment by taking these perverse medicines. And for those among them who have taken these jabs but wish to or really have repented of their sins, we ought to pray for them as well.

Yet another concerning relationship Putin's regime holds is its outreach to the Islamic world. Domestically, it has been predicted by Russia's Grand Mufti, Ravil Gainutdin, that the Muslim population will "...increase to 30 percent in a decade and a half."⁶⁵ This is no illusion on his end, as Russia's Muslim-majority regions have been statistically observed to have the highest birth rates in the entire nation. There is a serious threat of White Russians being ethnically replaced in their own nation, as a result of the high rate of abortion and lack of a stable population growth among their race. Though it is true,

as Russian demographer Victoria Sakevich has noted, that abortion rates have gone down in Russia over the recent years, the situation is still not a desirable one, as she explains:

It is noteworthy that in the youngest age group (up to 20 years old) both abortions and birth rates have gone down in recent years; this means that the incidence of abortion has decreased not because women prefer to give birth rather than end the pregnancy but as a result of more responsible sexual habits.⁶⁶

What she hides by the term “responsible sexual habits”, is that in place of abortion Russian women in Gen Z have overwhelmingly turned to contraception to kill the unborn. In turn, this is a major proof that there is no “religious revival” among the Russian Orthodox in that country. If there is any “religious revival” in Russia, it is among the Muslims!

Putin defends this state of affairs, much to the justifiable ire of Russian Nationalists. In fact, the President has gone so far as to denounce those who “insult” the false prophet Mohammed as violators of “religious expression”. In his view, stated in an annual press conference from last year, those who ridicule or illustrate the ills of that deceiver, warmonger, and pedophile offend “the sacred feelings of those who profess Islam.” He also stated that these insults give rise to extremist reprisals as a means to flimsily justify censorship in order to solidify Russia’s relationship with domestic and foreign Muslims.⁶⁷ By this logic, ought not the Russian government ban the publication and distribution of Dante’s *Inferno*, a work of Catholic genius admired even by secularists, because Mohammed is depicted there as residing in the depths of Hell, being torn apart continuously for his sin of cutting off entire regions of the world from the Christian religion? If Muslim extremists make their attacks, they are the ones who ought to be punished, not those who wish, in one way or another, to portray that antichrist, who ought – alongside such figures as Cain, Judas, Martin Luther, Robespierre, Lenin, and Joseph Stalin – to be reviled as the most despicable of all men in history. To ridicule or mock such a monster is not a crime – if anything, it is almost a virtue. While it is prudent for a Christian ruler with a large native Muslim

population to not go out of their way to incite them to an uprising, neither should they cower to their absurd demands.

This pro-Muslim position of Putin's is not a recent one. During a speech in 2010 in which he wished to emphasize the ties between Russians and Caucasians, he stated that:

“Russia was initially formed as a multinational and multi-confessional state. You know, we have Eastern Christianity, and some theorists say that it is much closer to Islam than Catholicism.”⁶⁸

These “theorists” that Putin implicitly agrees with here can only be right in one sense; Islam is closer to Eastern Christianity than Catholicism, because both Islam and Eastern Christianity are false religions!

Evidently, that is not the sense Putin is attempting to convey here. These examples, only few of many of demonstrating support of Mohammendanism, relate to his friendly ties with the Muslim majority former Soviet nations he has courted into the suspiciously Eurasian “Commonwealth of States” and the present Moscow-Tehran alliance. It is well worth observing that Putin here follows Dugin's recommendation, outlined in *Foundations of Geopolitics*, for how the Russian state ought to present itself to the Muslim world. As the *Wikipedia* summary for this book once again relates:

The book stresses the "continental Russian-Islamic alliance" which lies "at the foundation of anti-Atlanticist strategy". The alliance is based on the "traditional character of Russian and Islamic civilization".

Iran is a key ally. The book uses the term "Moscow-Tehran axis".⁶⁹

This continental “Russian-Islamic alliance” is in reality a coalition against the Bride of Christ, Holy Mother Church and what remains of Christendom. Corrupt as the West has

Thus no Catholic ought to profess themselves a “Eurasianist” or a “Duginist”, neither should they support Putin’s Russia.

An excerpt from “Putin’s Revolution”, by Fr. Vladimir Moss, an Eastern Orthodox priest:

A third major change of tactics that Putin’s revolution has necessitated is in relation to religion... In order to understand this change, we must first inquire into Putin’s personal religion (if he has any)...

When Putin became president, he presented himself as “all things to all men”: a communist to the communists, a capitalist to the capitalists, a democrat to the democrats, a nationalist to the nationalists, and an Orthodox to the Orthodox. And yet Putin is no believer. On September 8, 2000, when asked by the American television journalist Larry King whether he believed in God, he replied: “I believe in people...”

This refusal to confess a faith in God is not surprising. It should be remembered, as Konstantin Preobrazhensky points out, that Putin “began his career not in the intelligence ranks but in the ‘Fifth Branch’ of the Leningrad Regional KGB, which also fought religion and the Church. Putin carefully hides this fact from foreign church leaders, and you will not find it in any of his official biographies... The myth of Putin’s religiosity is important for proponents of ‘the union’. It allows Putin to be characterized as some Orthodox Emperor Constantine, accepting the perishing Church Abroad under his regal wing. For his kindness we should be stretching out our arms to him with tears of gratitude...”

“For those who claim,” writes Professor Olga Ackerly, “that the ‘CIS is different from the USSR’ and Putin is a ‘practising Orthodox Christian’, here are some sobering facts. The first days and months Putin’s presidency were highlighted by the reestablishment of a memorial plaque on Kutuzovsky Prospect where Andropov used to live. The plaque was a symbol of communist despotism missing since the 1991 putsch, bearing Andropov’s name – a former head of the KGB, especially known for his viciousness in the use of force and psychiatric clinics for dissidents. On May 9, 2000, Putin proposed a toast to the ‘genius commander’ Iosif Stalin and promoted many former KGB officers to the highest state positions...”

“Important to note is that the Eurasian movement, with ties to occultism, ecumenism, etc. was recently revived by Putin, and a Congress entitled ‘The All-Russian Political Social Movement’, held in Moscow in April of 2001, was ‘created on the basis of the Eurasist ideology and inter-confessional [sic!] harmony in support of the reforms of President Vladimir Putin.’ The movement is led by Alexander Dugin, a sexual mystic,

National Bolshevik Party member, son of a Cheka cadre, personally familiar with the so-called 'Black International', advisor to the State Duma, and participant in Putin's 'Unity' movement."

Again, while claiming to be a devout Orthodox, as George Sprukts wrote in 2004,

“1) he lights menorahs when he worships at his local synagogue;

“2) he has worshipped the mortal remains of Kim Il Sung in North Korea;

“3) he has worshipped the mortal remains of Mahatma Gandhi;

“4) he ‘believes not in God, but in Man’ (as he himself has stated);

“5) he was initiated into an especially occult form of ‘knighthood’ in Germany;

“6) he has restored the communist anthem;

“7) he has restored the bloody red rag as the RF’s military banner;

“8) he has not removed the satanic pentagram from public buildings (including cathedrals);

“9) he has plans of restoring the monument to ‘Butcher’ Dzerzhinsky;

“10) he has not removed the satanic mausoleum in Red Square nor its filthy contents.”

Although Putin is clearly not an Orthodox Christian, he has many reasons for pretending to be one and for protecting the official Orthodox church. First, the MP hierarchs are his partners in organized crime and fellow agents in the KGB. This is illustrated by the activities of “the tobacco metropolitan”, now Patriarch Cyril Gundiaev, KGB Agent “Mikhailov”, who, as the Bulgarian Prime Minister pointed out recently with some disgust, is a billionaire who imports tobacco and alcohol duty-free.⁷¹
